Staying Safe Around Electrical Hazards



NORA Electric Cooperative takes safety around electricity very seriously. Electricity works by traveling in a completed circuit. Electricity always travels in the path of least resistance, and it tries to travel to the ground. Typically, we are safe around everyday uses of electricity; however, it's very important to be aware of the dangers associated with electricity and how to keep ourselves protected when situations arise that could potentially put us in danger of electric shock or fire.

Injuries and accidents happen when electrical appliances are used improperly, procedure is not followed, or when safety systems are disregarded. Only adequately trained qualified workers should attempt to work on repairing a potentially dangerous electrical situation. Use of common sense and following simple safety precautions can help avoid senseless injury and/or tragedy.

Encountering the following conditions requires exercising extreme caution:

- Working around overhead high-voltage powerlines: Trimming trees, climbing ladders, and flying kites can turn deadly if contact is made with a non-insulated overhead power line.
- **Keep Landscaping Away From Powerlines and Transformers:** Plant trees, shrubs, and bushes an acceptable distance away from distribution lines and transformers.
- Digging Near Buried Lines: Always call your local utility provider or 811 before digging.
 This applies to gas and water lines as well.
- Overloaded Circuits: Plugging in too many cords in a single outlet can be very dangerous causing the circuit to overheat and start a fire.
- Damaged Cords or Insulation on Wires: Immediately discontinue using a cord that is damaged or has exposed wire. Do not attempt to repair the cord. Have a qualified electrician repair or replace any damaged wires.
- Operating Portable Power Tools: Never use around wet areas.
 Immediately stop using if the tools overheat or start sparking. Repair or replace any damaged tools.

Keep Energy Savings In Mind During Spring Cleaning

As we begin to tackle spring cleaning chores as the months get warmer, it's important to incorporate energy savings into these efforts. Simple tasks can allow us to recognize savings and sustainability year round.

Make it a point to give your refrigerator some extra attention during spring cleaning. Keeping the coils free from dust will enable the motor to run more efficiently. Making sure the inside of the fridge and freezer is clean and not overfilled will also improve air flow & efficiency.

When cleaning windows, inspect the seals for any cracks or gaps causing air infiltration. Seal any leaks by spreading caulking around the windowpane.

Cleaning dust off light fixtures and bulbs can increase brightness. This is also a great time to replace older incandescent bulbs with energy efficient LED bulbs.

Vacuuming air ducts, dusting around vents, and changing air filters for HVAC units will improve air flow and help keep dust and allergens in check.
