

Executive Vice President & General Manager Outlines Updates for Members

NORA Electric Cooperative's Executive Vice President and General Manager, Anthony Mercure, welcomed members to the 73rd Annual Member Meeting and provided a valuable update on what has taken place within the cooperative over the past year.

The list below itemizes a number of expenses that were necessary in the maintenance and upkeep of the aging NORA office. Mercure emphasized the importance offering a safe and healthy environment to the employees who spend the majority of their day servicing the needs of members.

Other recent major expenses include the renewal of the USDA Operational Plan Special Use Permit which allows the NORA field crew to access and trim trees within the Carson National Forest. There were also some new equipment purchases including a digger derrick which is needed to drill holes, lift, and set poles, and two new Ford F150 work pickup trucks.

He also explained that NORA is currently in negotiations with the Jicarilla Anthony Mercure Apache Nation Power Authority (JANPA) to connect a loop feed with their line to be used in case of an emergency as there is currently only one loop feed servicing NORA. We will provide more information on the status of this negotiation as details become available.
